

<b>Quercus</b>	cerris	"Argenteovariegata"	A variegated form of the Turkey Oak. A magnificent tree with grey-white bark and wavy-edged green leaves with creamy-white margins. Produces acorns in cups covered with long slender scales. Height after 10yrs. 3m. Eventual height 20m. (not in our lifetime)
<b>Quercus</b>	coccinea		A rounded deciduous tree with pale grey-brown bark and glossy, dark green leaves turning bright red in autumn. Produces acorns. Eventual height 20m. Spread 15m. Flowers from May to June. Well-drained soil in sun or part shade.
<b>Quercus</b>	dentata	"Carl Ferris Miller"	A slow growing Oak with large deeply lobed leaves, reaching 30cm. on mature specimens. Autumn colour is a warm brown with leaves usually hanging on well into winter. After 10 yrs., height 3m. and spread 2m. Moist well-drained lime-free soil in sun or par
<b>Quercus</b>	ilex		"Holm Oak". A rounded, evergreen tree with dark grey bark and glossy, dark green leaves, silvery grey when young. Produces rounded acorns. Height 25m. Spread 20m. Well-drained soil in sun or part shade. Shelter from cold drying winds.
<b>Quercus</b>	pontica		A deciduous small tree or large shrub with large ovate to obovate leaves, strongly ribbed and serrated. They turn yellow-brown in autumn. Yellow catkins are followed by large acorns. Height 6-10m. Spread 3-5m. Moist well-drained soil in sun. Dislikes chal
<b>Quercus</b>	robur	"Menhir"	A slow growing form of our native oak. The leaves are the familiar oak leaves but the growth is bushy, compact and narrow. Height after 10 years is 1.5-2m. and the spread 0.5m. Moist well-drained soil in sun.
<b>Quercus</b>	rubra		A vigorous, spreading tree with smooth greyish brown bark. Matt dark green leaves turn yellow to red-brown in autumn. Produces acorns. Height 25m. Spread 20m. Well-drained soil in sun. Flowers from May to June. Deciduous
